### Principal's Message

As this is the final Newsletter for this term, I would like to begin by wishing you all a safe and happy holiday break.

Of course our Year 12 students have a "STUDY" rather than holiday break which I am sure they will use wisely to prepare for the HSC proper which will commence in early October.

I would also like to take the time to comment on perhaps one of the most contentious issues for all families - bullying. Nothing stirs the angst of parents more than a child who comes home upset, or worse, doesn't want to attend school for fear of being harassed.

The problem is exacerbated by social networking sites which are used by some to perpetuate such vile and cowardly behaviour.

This school is committed to eradicating this socially unacceptable behaviour, as is the DEC. We are currently reviewing our practices in this area to ensure we are both proactive and developmental in instilling in students a values code which rejects such behaviour.

It is bitterly disappointing when some parents / caregivers believe the school in some way tacitly accepts such behaviour. We do not!

What we do need is support from students by early reporting of such behaviour to staff, especially Year Advisers, Head Teachers, the Deputy Principals' and myself.

We will do everything possible to work with students to ensure this behaviour is stamped out. Indeed suspension and / or expulsion is definitely on the table, as is the concept of procedural fairness, which dictates that all involved be afforded access to due process as defined by DEC policy.

I look forward to progress in this area in the months ahead.

I am sure that those parents /care-providers that had the opportunity to view the Industrial Technology Major Works, which were on display in the library came away in awe at the abilities of our students. It would be remiss of me not to mention both Mr Orth and Mr Kershaw who gave up plenty of weekends to work with students to move them to the exceptional quality of finished products on display.

Likewise with our Creative and Performing Arts staff who hosted the CAPA evening recently. The rich bank of talent at this school in the arts is both refreshing and delightful! Well done to all!

A Peer Support day was held for all of Year 7 and their Year 10 Peer Support Leaders on Wednesday the 29 August. The focus of this workshop was bullying and effective coping strategies. I would personally like to thank our Peer Support co-ordinators Miss Fotheringham and Mr Orange for their wonderful organisation. A special mention to Mrs Napier and Miss Munro for their contribution in making the day a success.

The Year 7 AFL Social Skilling Program concluded on Monday 3 September. Thanks to Stuart Haack, who is the Sydney Swans School's Development Co-ordinator for the Illawarra, for running the program. I would also like to thank Mr Neill, Sam Clune and George Papadimas for assisting in the supervision of the students during this program.

The Save-a-Mate Drug and Alcohol Education Program which is being co-ordinated by The Red Cross is nearing its completion. This program has targeted all of our Year 9 students and has proven to be quite successful.

Mr Neill has recently conducted and is still in the process of organising further Individual Learning Plan meetings for all of our students with identified disabilities who receive funding support, plus other identified students.

Recently, Prue Salter from Enhanced Learning Educational Services, ran a study skills session with Year 10-12 students and a study skills evening with Year 7 parents and students.

The main area covered for Year 10 was the importance of using the next 6 months as a training period to prepare for senior studies. Students need to learn how to work effectively at home, manage distractions, make brain-friendly study notes and work out which study techniques work best for them.

Year 10 students should also complete the self-evaluation quiz at the back of their handout which will give them an indication of how ready they are for senior studies and what areas they need to work on.

The main topics for the Year 11 session were setting up an effective home study environment, managing resources for school, both paper and digital, working effectively at home and dealing with distractions, using the diary as a planning tool, making brain-friendly study notes and using a wide variety of active study techniques.

The session for Year 12 focused on the upcoming Trial HSC exams and how students should approach the next few weeks. Year 12 also learnt how research about the brain could be used to make their study more effective.

The Year 7 parent / student evening helped families put systems in place to help students work towards achieving their personal best in an efficient and effective way. Students examined their home study environment, the way they organise and manage their papers, how to work effectively at home and deal with distractions. They also learnt how to manage the workload in high school, and the steps to studying in high school - making study notes, learning the notes by testing yourself and doing as much practise as possible.

Parents are encouraged to review the handout from the sessions with students and discuss the main areas identified where changes need to be made. Parents can also find extra study skills tips on the following website: http://studyskillstoptipsparents.com/ "

Louise Hakkenbrock, who is our resident Youth Worker from Shellharbour City Council, is currently running Rock and Water anti bullying workshops for Years 7 and 8 students and a Healthy Choices program for a number of identified students.

Just a reminder that After School Tutoring is still available on a Tuesday afternoon from 1:45pm in E21. A number of parents / caregivers have expressed an interest in accessing this service throughout the year, but numbers have remained low.

Mrs Mavrikis' Year 10 Maths class, Mr Cairncross' Year 7 Health class and Mr Jones' Year 8 Gifted and Talented Class are currently participating in the In2Uni Program where University of Wollongong students have tailored a specific program over the course of the whole term.

Also our Year 11 and Year 12 students who are part of this program recently completed their Term 3 workshops focusing on essay writing and transition.
